Do you think she will become successful in her mission?


Ans – Yes I think, she will become successful in her mission. Because where there is a will, there is a way. So she will succeed.



Ans – Disagree. Actually, the narrator saved the baby langur from the merciless attack of the dominant male langur.





returning from your school?




Mother-child relationship is one of the most special relationships in the world. The love and affection between a mother and her child is incomparable to any other relationship. No one
