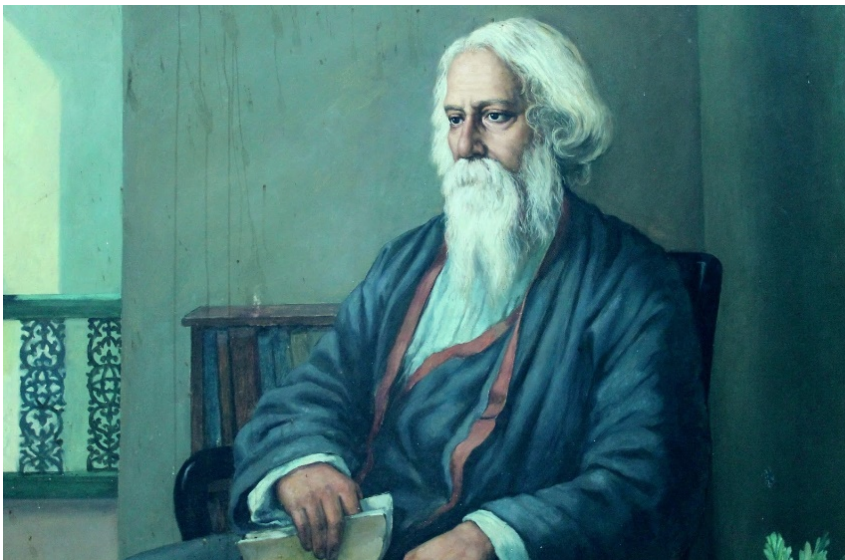


## A Little Grain of Gold
