- 2. Poet/Author The poem is by an anonymous (unknown) poet.
- **3. Rhyme Scheme -** The rhyme scheme of the stanzas is 'abcb'.
- **4. Figure of Speech -** The figure of speech in the poem is 'metaphor'


1.3. 'Hope' is the thing with feathers -
