

Alliteration (अनुप्रास अलंकार):

Alliteration is the repetition of the beginning (Consonant) sounds of neighbouring words.

या अलंकारात भाषेचा गोडवा, सौंदर्य, गेयता वाढवण्याकरता समान व्यंजन ध्वनींची पुनरावृत्ती केली जाते.

Examples:

- (1) Each day **b**ringing new **b**eginnings,
- (2) Travel **d**own the **d**arkened road,
- 3) **B**ring out the **b**est in me.
- (4) That **l**ife is **l**ived its very best.

(5) And **f**it **f**or life each day

(6) I want to **s**ow many, **s**mall, **s**mall moons of light.

(7) The route is tough and full of **s**nakes and **s**corpions.

(8) I want to sow seeds of moon on the sides of the path.

(9) O **m**oon, give me **m**oonlight,
basketful of two basket full.

(10) O **m**oon give me a basketful of **m**oonlight on loan.

(11) You **s**tart dying **s**lowly...

(12) In **f**orm and **f**eature, **f**ace and limb.

(13) It puzzled all our **k**ith and **k**in,

(14) One day, to **m**ake the **m**atter worse.

- (15) Our close resemblance **t**urned the **t**ide
(16) **B**ecame my **b**rother's wife.
(17) As **w**e were being **w**ashed by nurse.
(18) With **s**ixty **s**econds' worth of distance run.
(19) **W**ith **w**orn-out tools.
(20) The only other **s**ound's the **s**weep.
(21) The woods are lovely, **d**ark and **d**ee**p**.
(22) And then I **s**topped to buy **s**ome **s**weets
(23) With eyes to **s**ee the **s**unset's glow
(24) The **s**hip is anchored **s**afe and **s**ound,
its voyage closed and done.
(25) It is some **d**ream that on the **d**eck.

Repetition (पुनरावृत्ती अलंकार)

words are repeated in a sentence for pleasing or musical effect, the figure of speech is Repetition.

(या अलंकारात काव्याचे सौंदर्य व त्यातील माधुर्य वाढवण्याकरता शब्दांचा पुनःपुन्हा उपयोग केलेला असतो.)

Examples:

- (1) **S**mall, **s**mall moons of light.
(2) I want to sow many, **s**mall, **s**mall moons of light.
(3) In fact, **y**ear after **y**ear the same.
(4) And yet don't look **t**oo good, nor talk **t**oo wise.

(5) O **Captain!** My **Captain!** our fearful trip is done;
(6) But O **heart! heart! heart!**
(8) O **Captain!** My **Captain!** rise up and hear the bells.
(9) Rise up-**for you** the flag is flung-**for you** the bugle trills.
(10) **For you** bouquets and ribbon'd wreaths-**for you**
the shores a-crowding.
