

Apostrophe (परोक्ष संबोधन अलंकार)

When a non-living thing or an invisible entity such as God is treated as a person and spoken to, the figure of speech is Apostrophe.

(या अलंकारात निर्जीव, अनुपस्थित, काल्पनिक गोष्टी सजीव आहेत असे समजून विधान केलेले असते.)

Examples:

- (1) Please open up my eyes, dear **Lord**,
- (2) Help, **Lord**, to just say “no”
- (3) O **moon**, give me moonlight.

(4) O **God**, forgive me when I whine.

(5) O **Captain!** My Captain! our fearful trip is done.

(6) But O **heart!** heart! heart!

(7) O the bleeding drops of red.

(8) O **Captain!** My Captain! rise up and hear the bells.

(9) Exult, O **shores**, and ring, O bells!

Hyperbole (अतिशयोक्ती अलंकार)

When a statement is overstated or exaggerated for effect, the figure of speech is Hyperbole.

(या अलंकारात एखादी कल्पना, विचार किंवा घटना अतिशयोक्तीपूर्ण अधिक फुगवून सांगितलेली असते.)



Examples:

- (1) I want to sow seeds of moon
- (2) And when I died, the neighbours came
And buried brother John.
- (3) For somehow, my intended bride
Became my brother's wife.
- (4) For one of us was born a twin,
Yet not a soul knew which.

(5) My brother John got christened me,
And I got christened him.

(6) And I was always getting flogged,
For John turned out a fool.

(7) To watch his woods fill up with snow.

(8) The ship has weathered every rack.

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
