The "Tsunami" tidal wave that occurred during the 2004 –Sumatra- Andaman earthquake of Mw 9.3 was primarily caused by vertical displacement of the seafloor. The earthquake and the resulting Tsunami in the Indian Ocean affected many countries in Southeast Asia and beyond. Including Indonesia, India and many other countries. This Tsunami-genic earthquake was one of the ten worst earthquakes in recorded history and was also the single worst Tsunami in history. The intensity of the natural phenomenon was far beyond the assessment of the meteorology department. The disaster drew the attention of affected countries for setting up effective Tsunami warning system and institutional mechanism for handling disasters. Government of India has put in place an Early Warning System for mitigation of such oceanogenic disaster under control of Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS), Hyderabad. Seismic and sea-level data are continuously monitored in the Early Warning Centre using custom-built software application. Software generated alarms in the warning centre whenever a pre-set threshold is crossed.

The vision of NDMA is "To build a safer and disaster resilient India by a holistic, pro-active technology driven and sustainable development strategy that involves all stakeholders and fosters a culture of prevention, preparedness and mitigation". NDMA generates prompt and efficient response during disaster. The entire process will centre-stage the community and will be provided momentum and sustenance through the collective efforts of all government agencies and Non-Governmental Organizations. India faced a severe cyclone storm when Hudhud hit the country's east coast at Vishakhapatnam on 12th October 2014. It has been the most devastating one in recent times which made landfall in an urban area and caused tremendous loss to natural resources.

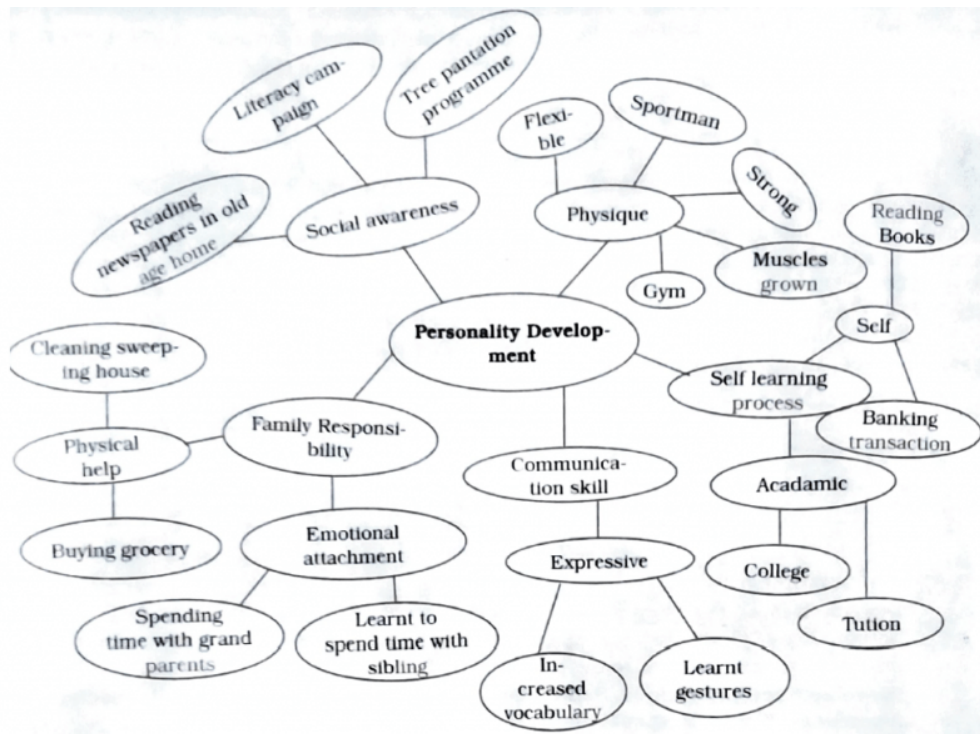

- (1) The narrator E R Braithwaite is the main character of the novel, who was working as an engineer in an oil refinery. He also had served the Royal British Air Force in the war. Being a black person, after he was unable to find job. In a final attempt, he applied for the post of a teacher in a school and gets appointed in the Greenslade School in London's East End. Braithwaite had bitter feelings about English and colonialism and about his white students as they do not consider him to be one of them. Initially, in school, he consider his students disrespectful, ill-mannered and mischievous whereas his students were considering him arrogant outsider, unfamiliar with the social environment in which students had grown up. Right from the first day students were harassing him including girl students. He verbally scolds them for being unruly in the class. He changes himself and handles students as adults and respectable person. He starts calling all girls as Miss and his students call him Sir. After weeks students come completely changed in hygiene

and in their attitude towards one another. He handles students in an amicable way. He takes them to field visits and gives them cultural exposure. He learns to forgive his students though they frequently disappoint him. In the half yearly report presentation students also surprise him with their maturity, empathy and knowledge. Whereas the head teacher's character is seen in the beginning of the half yearly report. He initially talks about the aims and objectives of the school and meeting. Mr. Florian are two characters in this novel. Mr. Florian the head of the school addressed the students in the beginning of the half yearly report. In his long address he spoke about aims and policies of the school and important contribution each child could make in strengthening those aims. He praised students wherever required but also made a point that there was yet a great deal of important to be done by students in conduct, cleanliness and in the pursuit of knowledge. Initially he was against the presentation of half yearly report. (2 marks)

- (2) Extract 17 of the novel which is given for our study is about half yearly report of the students' council of Greenslade School which was located in London's East End. The half yearly report was to the faculty and other students about what they have been studying till now. The report begins with the lower class and last turn was of Braithwaite's class. His class representatives spoke knowledgeably about their course book and they specifically told about how much they have learnt about different people, cultures, people as well as importance of important national and international cooperation. Two main students of his class Miss Joseph and Denham presided over the meeting. In the beginning the head teacher Mr. Florian addressed the students. Fogg is a large hearted person. Even

though Fogg had no enough money, he had now only one thousand pounds he divided it in to Passepartout and Aouda. On the next day Aouda and Phileas Fogg get married the next day. Later on Passepartout tells Fogg if they would have not gone India, they would have gone around the world in just seventy eight days. He immediately answers him that in that case he would have not met Aouda and she would have not been his wife. The chapter 37 ends on a striking note. Verne preaches a moral at the end, that love and its attainment is more important than all the challenges and money in the world. Fogg is extremely happy to be with Aouda. The novel and chapter ends with happy notes.

Passepartout is called to inform the father of the church. There he realises that tomorrow is not Monday but the Sunday. And he immediately pushes him and takes to the Reform Club. There he reaches in time and win the wager. In this way finally we can say that he has got justice. He met his love as well as he wind the bet of reaching the London in just 78 days before what he had decided. His journey is an adventure journey and he had taken all measures train, walk, Ship and all parts of the world he went. But finally justice is served to him. (2 marks)
