Thinking about the Text

Q1."I'll take the risk". What is the risk? Why does the narrator take it?

Ans: A huge storm was brewing up and the author waskeen to reach his home to spend his holiday with his family. So, he decided to fly through the storm as he did not want to miss the chance to meet his family at breakfast. Thus he took the risk even when the visibility was almost zero in the storm.

Q2.Describe the narrator's experience as he flew the aeroplane into the storm.
