You don't have beautiful car.

• My parents have grey hair.

My parents don't have grey hair.

He doesn't have new bike.

She has beautiful dress.

She doesn't have beautiful dress.

It has green leaves.

It doesn't have green leaves.

Ravi has blue eyes

Ravi doesn't have blue eyes.
